spots around the watershed as they make their seasonal journey!*

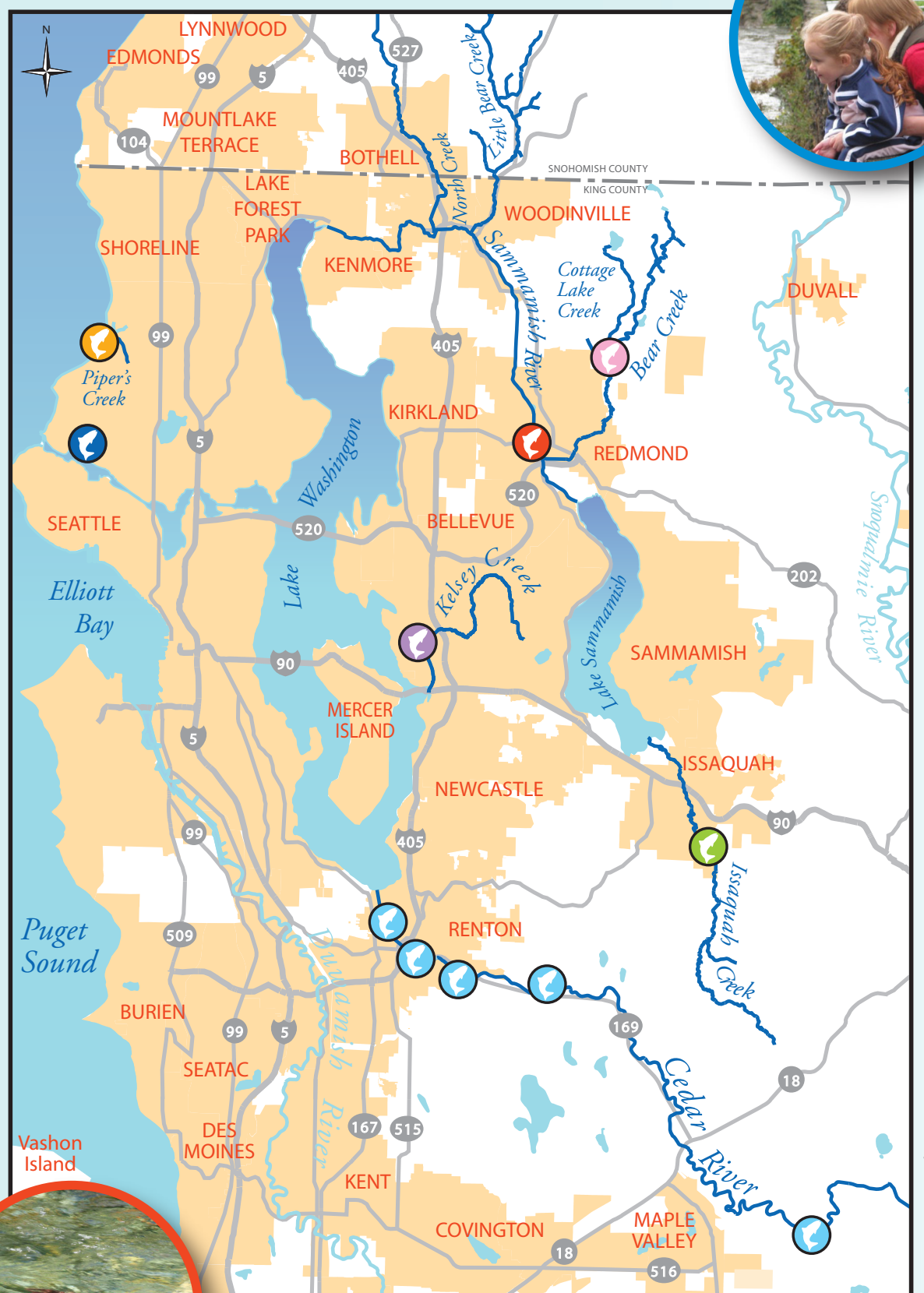
