

# Habitat Protection and Restoration in WRIA 8

## Cedar Population (Cedar River)

- Over 150 acres of floodplain protected
- 4.25 miles of streambank protected
- 73 acres of floodplain reconnected
- Over 300 acres of riparian area treated
- Nearly 8,000 linear feet of lakeshore enhanced

## Sammamish Population (Sammamish River, North Lake Washington Creeks, Bear Creek, Issaquah Creek)

- Over 110 acres of floodplain protected
- 6.4 miles of streambank protected
- 150 acres of riparian area treated



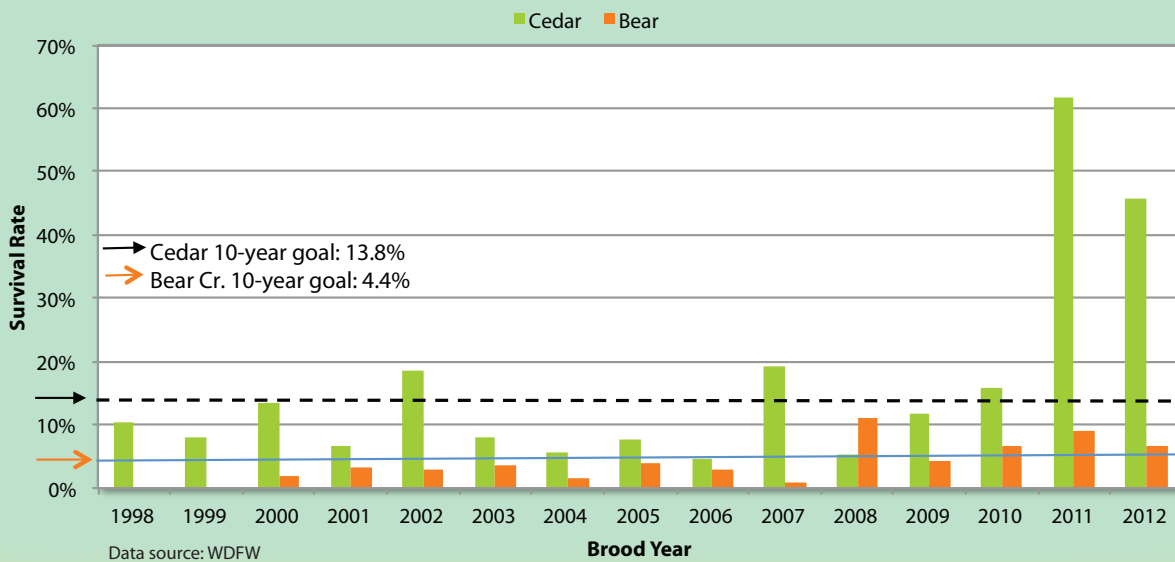

## Salmon Monitoring

- **Fish OUT** (juvenile productivity, affected by habitat extent/condition and winter flooding)
- **Fish IN** (abundance, affected by ocean conditions/survival and fishing)

Egg-to-migrant Survival Rate 1999-2012 Brood Years

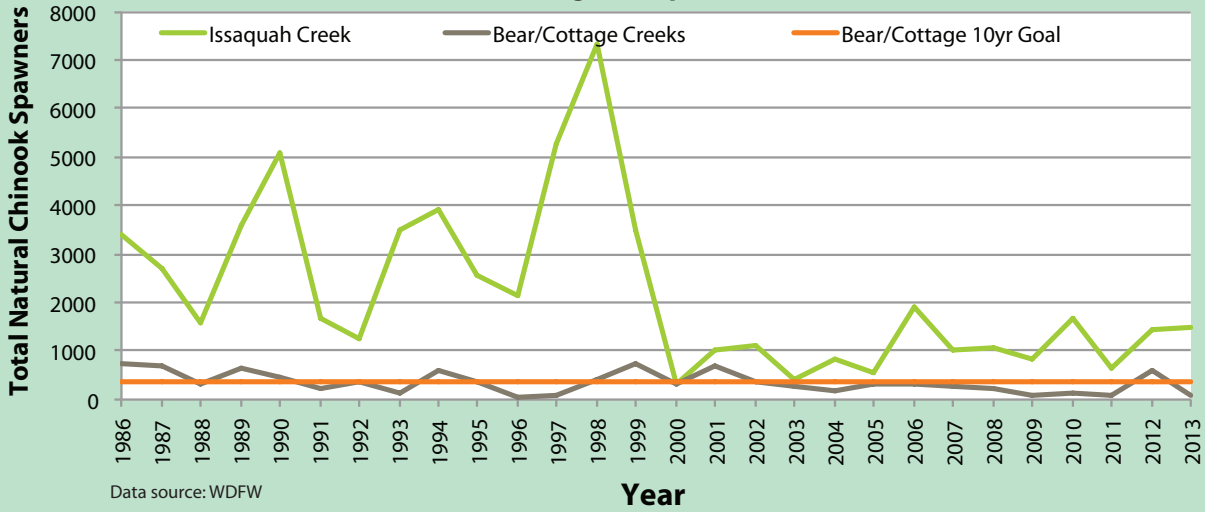
